

Water Areas

Create realistic water areas, such as lakes, ponds, rivers, waterfalls and more.




Realistic Water

Realistic Water dries clear and the reflective surface gives the illusion of depth. Use it to model rivers, ponds, lakes and more.

Basic Use

Do NOT shake bottle of Realistic Water. This will create unwanted bubbles.

1. Prepare water area. (See Paint Water Areas page 161)
2. Pour Realistic Water slowly onto prepared water area. Pour no deeper than 1/8". If water area is deeper than 1/8", dry 24 hours between 1/8" layers.
3. Pull out to edges with a Stir Stick, toothpick or tip of Foam Brush.



- Water Area Ideas



Run a continuous bead of Project Glue around the perimeter of a water area to contain Realistic Water. Let Project Glue dry before pouring Realistic Water.



When painting a water area, use dark paint colors to model deep water and light colors to model shallow areas near the shoreline. (See Paint pg. 161)



Model a swamp area with Realistic Water, Wild Grass and twigs.
