Did you know?

There are numerous zoos and national parks in North America where visitors can view animals in their natural habitats. A magnificent example is the United State's first national park, Yellowstone, with 2.2 million acres of wilderness and wonders.

Fun Fact!

Bear cubs learn about survival from their mother. She teaches them how to hunt, fish, climb trees and escape predators.





Rock Castings

- Mix and use Casting Plaster per Basic Use instructions.
- Pour into Rock Mold, let set for 30-40 minutes.

TIP! For a variety of rock sizes, fill *Mold* less than half full and tilt on its edge.



- Cut off side flaps from 3/4" strip at folds. (Fig. 2a)
- This is the front panel for Project Base.



Terrain Profile

- Use the Backdrop to create the terrain profile for your diorama.
- Cut out using a hobby knife.

TIP! Find a photo of a wildlife scene to use as a reference for your diorama.



- Test fit Backdrop and 3/4" front strip in grooves on Project Base.
- · Attach with Project Glue.
- Make sure the label area faces forward.



Newspaper Wads

- Arrange newspaper wads into desired terrain shape over entire Base.
- Form a cave from smaller wads.
- Tape to hold in place.



Plaster Cloth

- Cover newspaper wads with wet Plaster Cloth (3" strips), bumpy side up.
- · Add 2 layers of Plaster Cloth.
- Turn diorama upside down and smooth wet *Plaster Cloth* on ceiling of cave.



Attach and Blend Rocks

- Attach Rock Castings to Plaster Cloth terrain.
- Poke 1" strips of wet Plaster Cloth around rock edges to fill in gaps.
- Let dry.



Leopard Spot

- · Dilute Rock Colors.
- Paint rocks with the Leopard Spot paint technique.

NOTE: Let rock castings dry 2-3 hours before coloring.



Earth Undercoat

- Brush diluted Earth Undercoat over entire terrain (avoid rocks).
- · Let dry.

NOTE: Save some diluted *Earth Undercoat* for Step 11.



Small Rocks & Sand

- Pour Talus into a plastic bag and seal.
- On a safe surface, tap Talus with a hammer until desired size is achieved.



- Pour crushed
 Talus into
 remaining Earth
 Undercoat.
- Mix with Stir Stick.
- Remove Talus, and let dry on newpaper.



Project Glue in Spray Bottle & Ground Cover

- Spray diluted Project Glue on greenery areas.
- Sprinkle Green Grass on glue. Spray with additional diluted Glue.
- Lightly sprinkle Evergreen Accent to highlight. Spray with diluted Glue.
- Lightly sprinkle Forest Green Accent around rocks. Thoroughly spray with diluted Glue to seal.



Foliage Fiber

- Stretch a layer of Foliage Fiber until thin and lacy.
- Spray with diluted Project Glue.
- · Sprinkle with Accents.
- Spray again to seal. Let dry.



- Glue sections of dried Foliage Fiber in place.
- Create vines and attach with Project Glue.
- Glue bunches of Shrubs in desired areas.



Evergreen Clippings

- Spray evergreen clippings with diluted Project Glue.
- Sprinkle with desired color of Accent.
- · Spray again to seal.



Plant Trees

- Plant trees in desired locations.
- Let dry.

TIP! Use twigs or dried flower clippings to model hibernating trees.



- Spray diluted Project Glue on rock debris areas.
- · Sprinkle Talus.
- · Spray again to seal.
- · Let dry.




- Pour Ice Effects on a piece of plastic wrap and spread with Stir Stick. Let dry. (Fig. 18a)
- When dry, cut plastic wrap into icicle shapes. (Fig. 18b)
- Stretch and twist plastic wrap for more natural looking icicles.
- Attach to diorama with *Project Glue*. (Fig. 18c)

TIP! Sprinkle a small amount of ultra fine iridescent glitter on *lce Effects* while it is wet. The glitter will make your icicles sparkle.



now Mixture

- Mix equal amounts of Snowflakes and Snow Base.
- Apply mixture with Stir Stick on desired areas.
- Sprinkle Snowflakes on snow mixture (while still wet).



Add Snow to Trees

- Using the Stir Stick, dab Snow Mixture on trees.
- Sprinkle additional Snowflakes while Snow Mixture is wet.



 Sprinkle Snowflakes over desired areas and spray with diluted Project Glue to seal.



Labels

- Use Project Glue to attach Scene Setters in desired areas.
- Label and add signage to your project.

Helpful Hint create a summer scene by leaving off Winter Effects.

More Ideas!

Create the most unique project in the class! This amazing cave diorama was built with the same basic modeling techniques used in the North American Wildlife project. The stalactites are strips of Plaster Cloth coated with Casting Plaster. The stalagmites formed from Casting Plaster that dripped naturally from the stalactites, similar to how they are actually formed in nature.
