

Did you know?

An aquarium is a tank with at least one glass side for keeping and exhibiting aquatic plants and animals. Aquariums come in all shapes and sizes. There are small ones, like ones found in homes, to very large ones housing dolphins and whales at marine mammal parks.

Fun Fact!

Sperm Whales can hold their breath up to 40 minutes!





ShowBox and Paint

- Assemble ShowBox.
- Paint an underwater scene inside your ShowBox.
- Paint the outside if desired.
- Let dry.



ReadyGrass Sheets

- Measure and cut ReadyGrass Sheet to fit bottom of ShowBox.
- Glue in place using Project Glue.

NOTE: Save remaining ReadyGrass for Step 4.



🐧 Newspaper Wads

- Wad small sections of newspaper to make sea rocks.
- You choose the size, shape and number of rocks.



- Cut sections of ReadyGrass to fit around newspaper wads.
- Use Project Glue to glue in place.
 Use rubber bands to hold shape while drying. (Fig. 4a)

TIP! When making rocks, some Desert Sand may fall off. Glue it on the sea floor to add realistic textures.



Ocean Plants Template

- Use templates to draw sea plants on white paper in a variety of heights and widths or use included templates.
- · Paint as desired. (Fig. 5a)
- · Set aside to dry. Then, cut out.

TIP! Curl sea plants using a pencil. This will give them a realistic shape.



Sculpt Figures, Plants & Animals

- Sculpt sea life (coral, sea vegetation, animals, etc.).
- · Paint as desired.
- · Set aside to dry.

TIP! Scenearama.com has Howto Videos.



- Design your aquarium. Decide where to put marine animals, vegetation and rocks.
- Glue vegetation, loose Desert Sand and rocks in place. (Fig. 7a)



- · Use Project Glue to install Scene Setters.
- For swimming animals, cut Project Wire to desired length and attach to Scene Setters. Glue opposite end to desired location.

TIP! Have a grown-up help you with this step.


